Supervisor Lanzetta explained that there is no new movement with Bayside.

Councilman Baker reported that the Town's new website is now live. He encouraged everyone to take a look at it and to email him if anyone sees anything that needs to be updated or added. There is a feature called Notify Me that anyone can sign up for which will give them the option to receive an email and/or text notification of an alert, a calendar event, and announcements. There are forms on the website and more will be added. The website address is www.townofmarlboroughny.com or www.townofmarlborough.org.

Councilman Corcoran added that the Town is looking into a YouTube account so Town Board meetings can be viewed on the website.

Councilman Koenig suggested adding the website address onto Town letterhead and water bills.

A). Sign Law

Supervisor Lanzetta stated that a lot of work was put into the sign law document prior to 2009. At that time there was a public hearing and the Town received feedback from the county but the law was never codified. The current Board is going to look through it and see what they would like to keep and omit. The Town has a sign law but it is very minimal.

The Board discussed the sign law document with Tom Corcoran. There was a brief discussion regarding pre-existing signs, which signs would be exempt from the law and the provisions for the exemptions, and which signs are eyesores. After speaking with Mr. Corcoran, the Town Board omitted a section in the sign law document that stated all signs and changes to signs need to go before the Planning Board. Tom Corcoran explained that the Planning Board would approve a site plan that would include signs according to the provisions in the law, then he would follow up with the site plan and issue sign/building permits. If there is a change or an update to a sign, he would issue a sign permit as long as the sign conforms to the law. The purpose of the sign law is not to hinder business and also to increase safety in the Town.

The Board discussed different types of signs with Tom Corcoran such as bench signs, inflatable signs, projection signs, billboards, flashing signs, mobile billboards, posters, free standing signs, wall signs, window signs; discussed each type of sign and whether they would keep or omit.

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Some of the Board members commented on the restrictiveness and format of the document and questioned some items that could be misinterpreted. The Board briefly discussed possibly adding to the law what rules would apply if a property becomes part of the overlay zone and is then in the Highway Development zone. There was a misunderstanding in how the law reads for creating visual unity among signs. Tom Corcoran explained and the Board decided to alter some information.

B). 2016 Goals & Objectives

Councilman Baker stated that he sent out goals and objectives to the Board so they have guidelines for the year; he would appreciate comments then they can discuss.
